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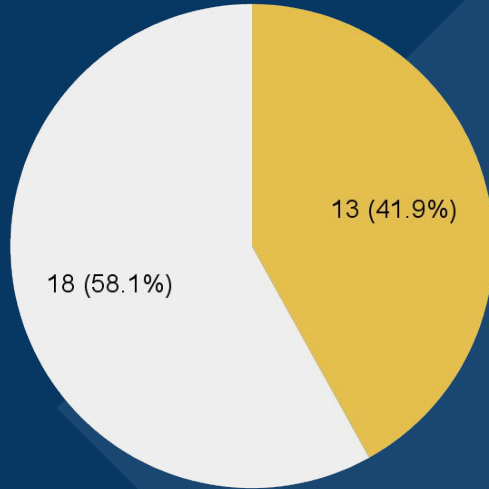
Survey Overview

- Follow-up research was done by reviewing policies and websites



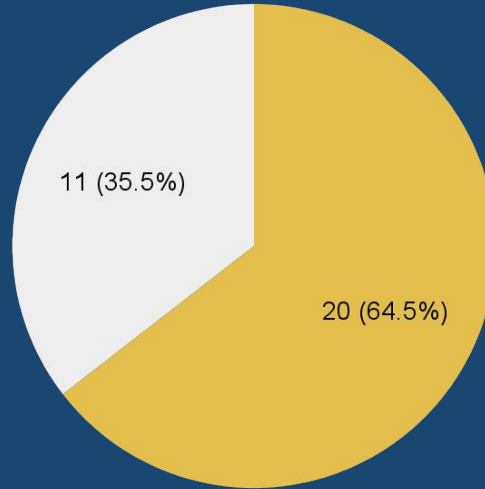
Responding Institution Demographics

Level



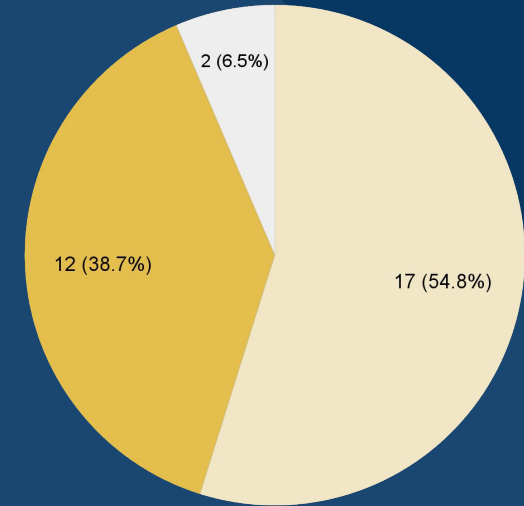
● 2-Year ● 4-Year

Applications and Fees



Only 2 institutions responded that they did not require an application to graduate, both of which are small private institutions.



13 Institutions or 42% of respondents charge a graduation fee.

- Majority of fees were \$33-55
- 3 mentioned fees that vary based on the degree a student is earning
- 2 mentioned fees that increase after a deadline

Master's, Doctoral, and Certificate Programs



Masters and Doctoral

- 16 Institutions offer Masters and/or Doctoral Programs
 - 7 Hood all Masters/Doctoral Candidates at the ceremony
 - 5 Hood students outside of the commencement ceremony
 - 4 Hood only Doctoral Candidates at the ceremony



Certificates

- 24 Institutions offer Certificates
 - 14 allow certificate students to participate in the commencement ceremony
 - 10 do not include certificate completers in the commencement ceremony



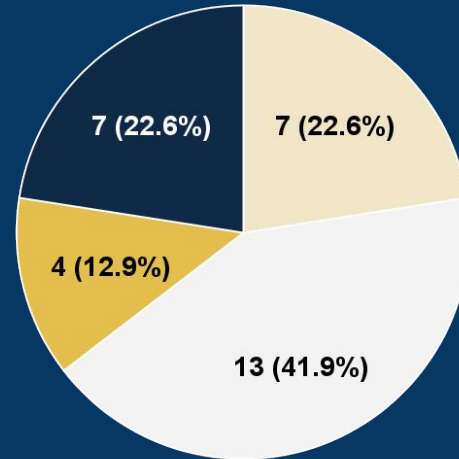
Walk Policies

- All respondents allow students to participate in a commencement ceremony before completing all degree requirements
- Best practices include
 - Students must submit a form
 - Students must be within a certain number of credits of completing their degree. Two or fewer remaining requirements is a common benchmark.
 - Students must show proof of enrollment in final credits needed

Regalia

- 22 Institutions have student order their own caps and gowns vs. 9 institutions that order and distribute caps and gowns to students
- 9 Institutions have policies discouraging unauthorized accessories

How is Cap and Gown Cost Covered?



- Built into a Fee
- Students Purchase
- Students Rent
- Covered by Institution

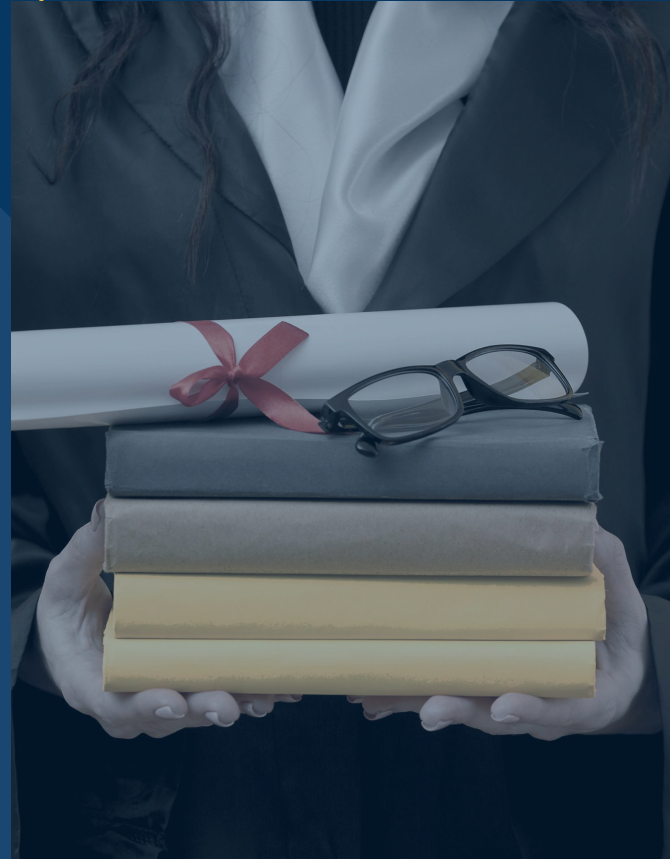


Only 2 institutions

Posthumous Degrees

- 16 Institutions have a posthumous degree policy
- Best practices include:
 - Written request by a family member or University representative
 - Completion of a minimum amount of credit hours, class standing, etc.
 - Student was in good standing academically and judicially
 - Student is included in Commencement program
 - Diploma is issued to the student's family
 - Alternate certificate for students who do not meet all of the requirements for a posthumous degree





Follow Up Questions and Topics of Discussion

Names

Do you allow preferred names on diplomas?

Do you allow students to be announced by a preferred name?

How do you ensure correct pronunciation at the ceremony?

Commencement

Are students required to participate in the ceremony?

Do you provide a digital program, printed program, or both?

Are students allowed a certain number of guests? Do you require tickets?

How are students seated/processed?

Do you award honorary degrees? How are the recipients chosen?

Diplomas

Do you include majors, minors, and/or concentrations on diplomas?

Do you print in-house or have a diploma vendor?

Do you offer or are you considering offering electronic diplomas?

Challenges



Student Expectations

- Students expecting more
- Students wanting to earn their degree in December but participate in the May ceremony
- Students thinking the ceremony equates to degree completion
- Calculation of Latin Honors (or similar) for the ceremony

Ceremony Logistics

- Location: Size, parking, accessibility
- Timing: Fitting multiple ceremonies in one day, ceremonies across multiple days
- Reader Cards
- Catching students who are not cleared to participate
